

ORDINANCE NO. 251

AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING THE MOTOR VEHICLE SPEED LIMIT ON FIFTEENTH STREET OF SAID CITY BETWEEN ~~CLAY~~ STREET AND LINCOLN STREET OF SAID CITY DURING SPECIFIED HOURS; PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES FOR THE VIOLATION THEREOF; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HERewith AND PROVIDING WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL TAKE EFFECT AND BE IN FULL FORCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT CALHOUN, NEBRASKA:

SECTION 1: It shall be unlawful for any person to operate a motor vehicle at a rate of speed exceeding fifteen (15) miles per hour on Fifteenth Street in said City between Adams Street and Lincoln Street in said City between the hours of 8:00 o'clock, A.M., and 5:00 o'clock, P.M., on days on which the public schools of said City are in operation.

SECTION 2: Any person who shall violate any provisions of this ordinance shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof shall be fined in a sum not to exceed \$100.00.

SECTION 3: That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 4: This ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 261

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR MINIMUM WATER RATES IN THE CITY OF FORT CALHOUN, NEBRASKA, TO BE CHARGED TO THE USERS OF THE CITY WATER SYSTEM, REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HERewith AND PROVIDING WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE IN FORCE AND EFFECT.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT CALHOUN, NEBRASKA:

SECTION 1. The minimum water rates to be charged to users of the City water system of the City of Fort Calhoun, Nebraska, shall be:

- \$3.00 per month minimum up to 3,000 gallons;
- \$4.00 per month minimum up to 3,000 gallons for users residing outside the corporate limits of the City of Fort Calhoun;
- \$1.00 per month per 1,000 gallons exceeding 3,000 and up to 9,000 gallons;
- \$ .80 per month per 1,000 gallons exceeding 9,000 gallons and up to 19,000 gallons;
- \$ .65 per month per 1,000 gallons exceeding 19,000 gallons and up to 49,000 gallons;
- \$ .50 per month per 1,000 gallons exceeding 49,000 gallons.

SECTION 2. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This ordinance shall be in full force and take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE CREATION OF A BOARD OF PARK COMMISSIONERS FOR THE CITY OF FORT CALHOUN, NEBRASKA; PROVIDING FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF MEMBERS OF SAID BOARD; PRESCRIBING THE DUTIES OF SAID COMMISSIONERS; PROVIDING FOR THE ORGANIZATION OF SAID BOARD; PROVIDING FOR THE DISBURSEMENT OF FUNDS FOR PARK AND RECREATIONAL PURPOSES; PROVIDING FOR LIMITATIONS ON CONTRACTS ENTERED INTO BY THE BOARD OF PARK COMMISSIONERS; PROVIDING FOR AN ANNUAL REPORT FROM THE BOARD OF PARK COMMISSIONERS; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH AND PROVIDING WHEN THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE IN FORCE AND EFFECT.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT CALHOUN, NEBRASKA:

SECTION 1. There is hereby created in the City of Fort Calhoun, Nebraska, a Board of Park Commissioners consisting of five (5) members, all of whom shall be resident freeholders of the City of Fort Calhoun.

SECTION 2. The members of the Board of Park Commissioners shall be appointed by the Mayor and City Council of the City. Initial appointments shall be two members of the Board for a term of three years, two members for a term of two years and one member for a term of one year. Subsequent appointments shall be made for the term of three years. Appointments shall become effective the first Tuesday in June of each year.

SECTION 3. The members of the Board of Park Commissioners shall have charge of all of the parks belonging to the City and shall have the power to establish rules for the management, care and use of the same. It shall be their duty to lay out, improve and beautify all grounds and buildings now owned or hereafter acquired for public parks and to employ such helpers and laborers as may be necessary for the proper care and maintenance of such parks and the improvement and beautifying thereof, to the extent that funds may be provided for such purposes. Such Board shall also have charge of recreational facilities

now owned or hereafter acquired by the City of Fort Calhoun.

SECTION 4. The Board of Park Commissioners shall hold regular monthly meetings on the second Monday of each month from March to October at 7:00 o'clock, P.M. Special meetings may be called at any time by the Chairman. The place of meetings shall be determined by the Chairman. The members of the Board of Park Commissioners shall organize by electing one of their members as Chairman of said Board. Three members of the Board shall constitute a quorum for meetings. Before enterreing upon his duties each member of the Board shall take an oath to be filed with the City Clerk that he will faithfully perform the duties of his office and will not in any manner be actuated or influenced therein by personal or political motives.

SECTION 5. All expenditures of the Board of Park Commissioners for salaries and wages of its employees and all other expenses for the maintenance and operation of the parks of said City shall be audited and allowed by the Park Commissioners and paid by warrants signed by the Chairman of the Commissioners and shall be paid by the City Treasurer out of the Park Funds of said City.

SECTION 6. The Board of Park Commissioners of the City shall not enter into any contracts of any nature involving an expenditure of more than \$500.00 unless such contracts have been approved by the majority of the members of the City Council.

SECTION 7. The Chairman of the Board of Park Commissioners shall on January 1 of each year file with the City Clerk an itemized statement of all the expenditures and receipts of said Board for the preceding year.

SECTION 8. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in

conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 9. This ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

ORDINANCE NO. 281

It shall be unlawful for a person under the age of 16 ~~or any minor who is a high school student~~ to remain in or upon the public streets, parks, public buildings or public places within the City or to be found in any vehicle upon the streets of the City after the hour of <sup>10:00</sup>~~10:00~~ o'clock, P.M. of any day until the hour of 5:00 o'clock, A.M., of the following day unless said minor is accompanied by a parent, guardian or other adult person having the legal care, custody and control of said minor or unless such minor person is upon an emergency errand or legitimate business directed by his parents, guardian or legal custodian.

SECTION 2. It shall be unlawful for the parents, guardians or other adult persons having the care and custody of a minor under the age of 16 ~~or any minor who is a high school student~~ to allow or permit said minor to remain in or upon the public streets, parks, public buildings and public places within the City or in any vehicle upon the streets of the City between the hour of 10:00 o'clock, P.M., of any day and the hour of 5:00 o'clock, A.M., of the following day unless said minor is accompanied by his parents, guardian or other adult person having the legal care and custody of the minor or unless the minor is upon an emergency errand or legitimate business directed by his parents, guardian or legal custodian.

SECTION 3. Any person found guilty of violating any provision of this Ordinance may be fined in any amount not in excess of \$100.00 for any one offense and costs of prosecution.

SECTION 4. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 5. That this ordinance shall be in force and take effect from and after its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

The minimum monthly charge under this schedule shall be \$4.00 per month per meter.

All the above net rates apply only when bills are paid on or before ten (10) days after the monthly billing date. When not so paid the gross rate, which is ten per cent (10%) higher than the above rates, will apply.

The above and foregoing rates shall be understood to apply to and be based upon natural gas of the British Thermal Unit heating value of not less than nine hundred (900) British Thermal Units per cubic foot of gas.

If in any monthly period, the average heating value of such gas shall fall below nine hundred (900) British Thermal Units, then, in that event, the aforesaid



rates shall be automatically and correspondingly lowered, and reduced during any period or periods of time in which any such gas of lower British Thermal Unit value shall be furnished.

SECTION 2. That original Section 7 of Ordinance No. 207 of the City of Fort Calhoun, Nebraska, be, and the same hereby is, repealed.

SECTION 3. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage, publication and approval as required by law.



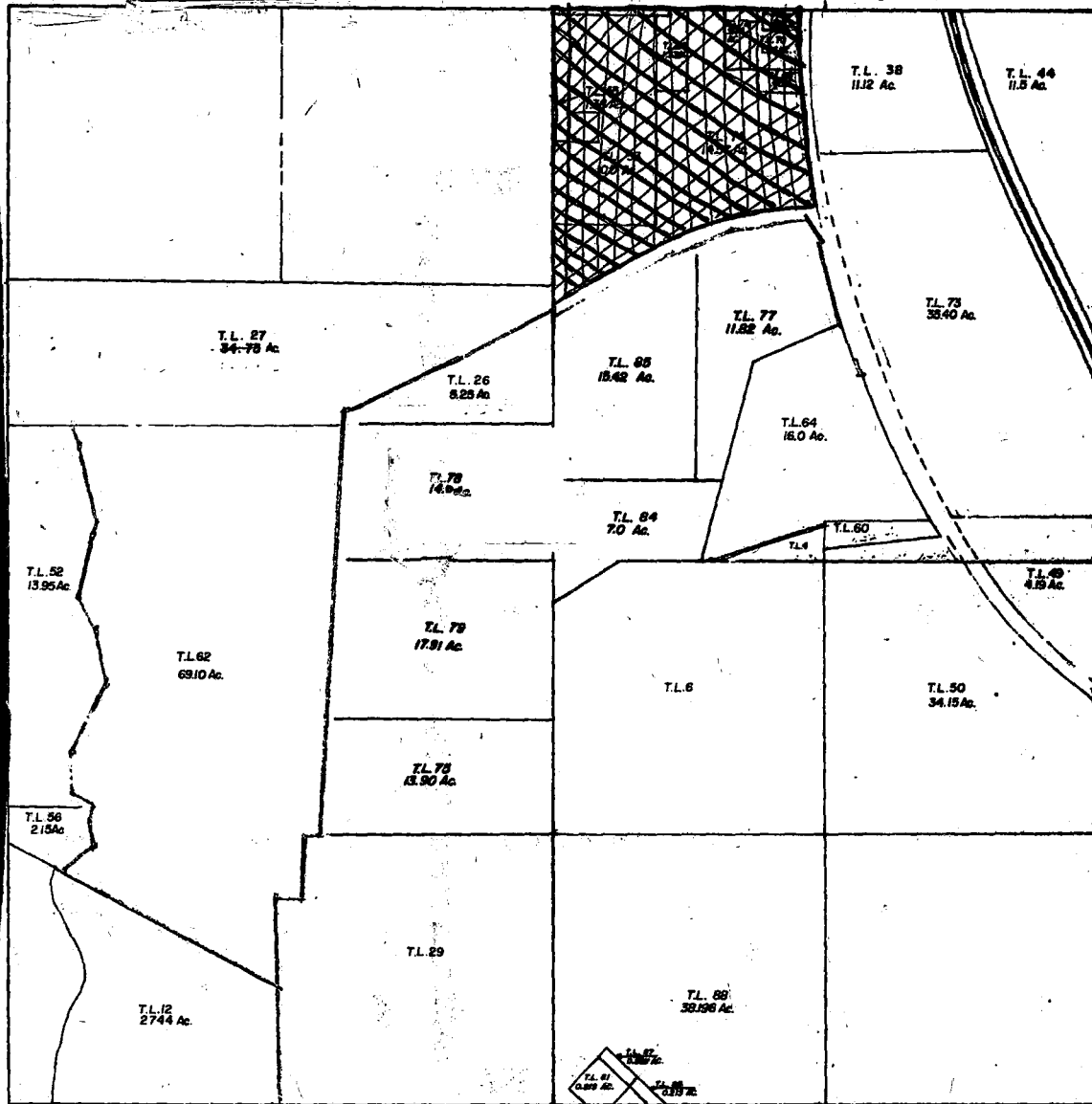

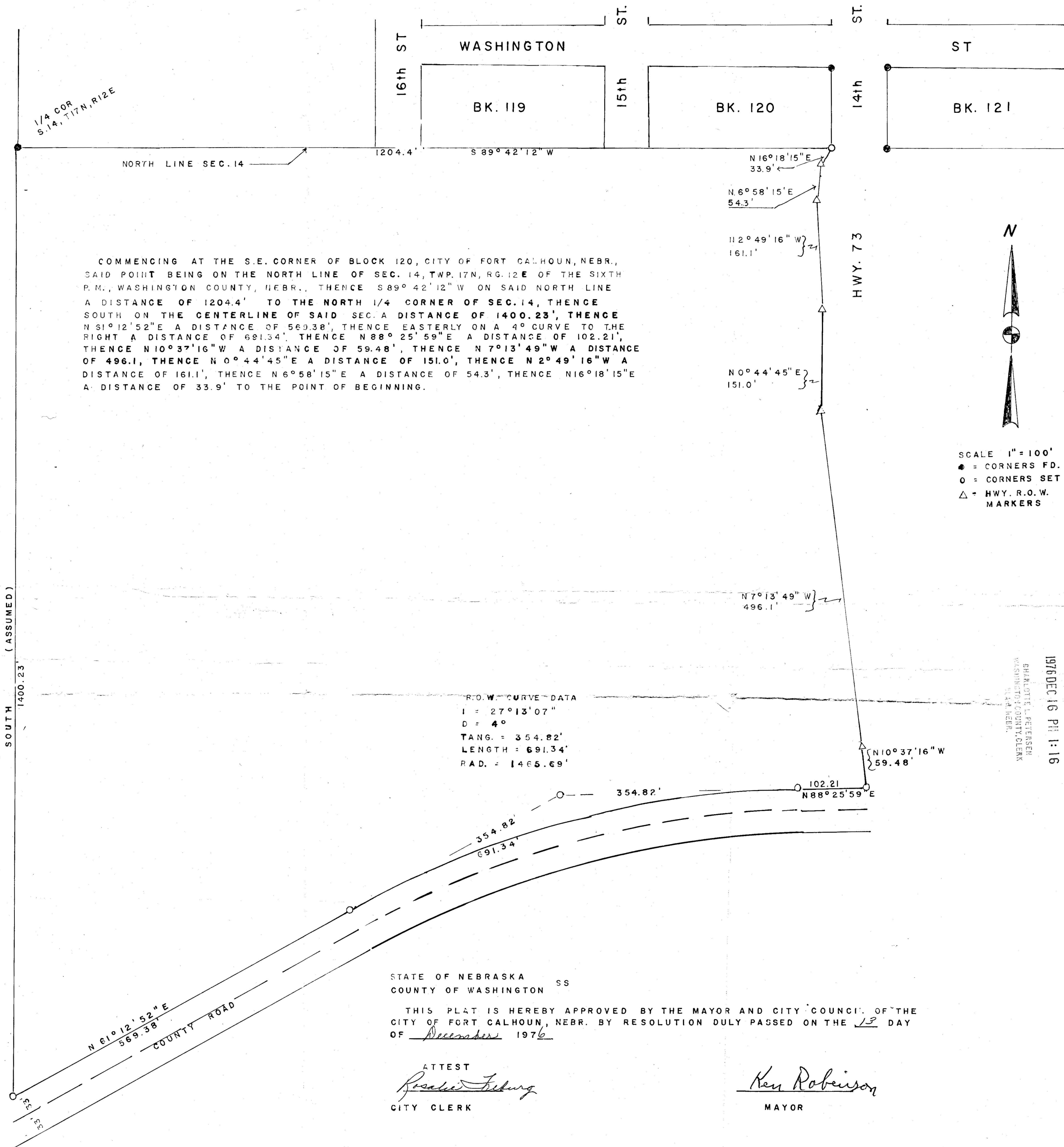

ORDINANCE NUMBER 98

AN ORDINANCE GRANTING TO OMAHA PUBLIC POWER DISTRICT AND TO ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, THE RIGHT, PRIVILEGE AND FRANCHISE TO ERECT POLES AND STRING WIRES AND CABLES THEREON; TO CONSTRUCT UNDERGROUND CONDUITS AND MANHOLES AND TO LAY WIRES AND CABLES IN UNDERGROUND CONDUITS AND THROUGH MANHOLES, AND TO STRETCH WIRES AND CABLES ALONG, OVER, UPON AND ACROSS THE STREETS, ALLEYS, AVENUES AND PUBLIC PLACES AND PUBLIC PROPERTY OF THE CITY OF FORT CALHOUN, NEBRASKA, FOR THE CONTINUOUS TRANSMISSION OF ELECTRIC CURRENT, EXCEPT FOR BREAKDOWNS AND CAUSES BEYOND CONTROL OF GRANTEE, THROUGH AND OVER SAID WIRES AND CABLES, AND TO CONSTRUCT AND ESTABLISH, EQUIP AND INSTALL AND/OR MAINTAIN AND OPERATE AN ELECTRIC HEATING, LIGHTING AND POWER PLANT AND/OR SYSTEM, AND TO CONDUCT A GENERAL ELECTRIC HEATING, LIGHTING AND POWER BUSINESS WITHIN THE SAID CITY OF FORT CALHOUN, NEBRASKA.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF FORT CALHOUN, NEBRASKA:

Section I

That Omaha Public Power District and its successors and assigns be and hereby are granted the right, privilege and franchise to erect poles with the necessary supports, crossarms and fixtures, and to string wires and cables thereon, and to construct underground conduits together with the necessary manholes and other appliances and to lay, place and stretch wires and cables therein along, over, upon, under and across the streets, alleys, avenues, public places and public property of the City of Fort Calhoun for the continuous transmission of electric current, except for breakdowns and causes beyond control of grantee, through and over said wires and cables, and to construct, establish, equip and install and/or maintain and operate an electric heating, lighting and power plant and/or system, and to conduct a general electric heating, lighting and power business within the said City of Fort Calhoun.

Section II

That said grantee, its successors and assigns, may under the direction of the properly constituted authorities of the City of Fort Calhoun make all necessary excavations in any part of the said streets, alleys, avenues, public places and public property for the purpose of erecting and maintaining poles and

other supports for its or their wires or conductors and for the purpose of repairing same and for the purpose of laying, repairing and maintaining such underground pipes, conduits and manholes and for placing, repairing, maintaining and operating said wires and conductors therein. All poles erected and maintained pursuant to the terms of this Ordinance shall be erected at the edge of the sidewalk unless otherwise directed by the properly constituted authorities and in a good and substantial manner. When any excavation shall have been made pursuant to the authority hereby granted, the grantee, its successors and assigns, shall restore the portion of the street, alley, avenue, public highway, or public property excavated to the same good order and condition in which it was prior to said excavation work and all said work shall be done in compliance with the reasonable and necessary rules, regulations, ordinances and orders which may during the continuance of this franchise be adopted by said City Council, or provided by law, and construction and said work of repairing said streets, alleys, avenues, public highways and public property shall be done to the satisfaction of said Council, or such official or officials as the law may designate.

### Section III

Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed as to in anywise prevent the proper authorities of said City from construction sewers, grading, paving, planking, repairing, altering, or doing any work that may be desired on any of the streets, alleys, avenues, public highways, or public property of said City, but all such work shall be done, if possible, in such a manner as not to obstruct, injure, or prevent the free use, occupation and enjoyment of the rights and privileges herein granted to the said Omaha Public Power District, and to its successors and assigns.

### Section IV

Whenever it shall be necessary in grading any street, avenue or alley of said

City, or in building any sidewalk or making any other improvements therein, or in moving buildings through or along the streets, to remove any pole or poles and wires belonging to the said grantee, its successors or assigns, on which any line or lines, wire or wires belonging to said grantee, its successors or assigns, shall be stretched or fastened, the said grantee, its successors or assigns, shall upon receiving fifteen days' notice from the properly constituted authorities remove such pole or poles, and wires, and if said grantee, its successors or assigns, upon such notice shall neglect to remove such pole or poles, and wires, then such pole or poles and wires may be removed by the properly constituted authorities of the City at the expense of said grantee, its successors or assigns.

#### Section V

Said grantee, its successors and assigns, hereby covenants and agrees to indemnify and save harmless the City of Fort Calhoun against all damages, costs and expenses whatsoever to which said City may be subject to in consequence of acts of negligence of the grantee, its successors or assigns, its or their agents, or servants in any manner arising from the rights and privileges granted herein.

#### Section VI

The rights, privileges and franchises hereby granted shall terminate at the expiration of twenty-five years from the date of the passage of this Ordinance, and shall commence the day this Ordinance becomes of force and effect.

#### Section VII

The said grantee, its successors or assigns, shall within thirty days after this Ordinance shall have been finally passed and approved, file in the office of the Clerk of said City, a written acceptance of this Ordinance and the franchise herein granted, and failure on the part of the grantee, its successors or assigns, to file such written acceptance within the time herein

specified, shall be an abandonment and rejection of the franchises and rights and privileges hereby granted and this Ordinance shall be forever null and void and such acceptance by said grantee, its successors or assigns, shall be an acceptance of all the terms and conditions and restrictions contained in this Ordinance.
