A regular meeting of the City Council of the City of Fort Calhoun, Nebraska, was held in open and public session at 7:00, on Monday, September 19, 2022, at the Fort Calhoun Council Chamber, 110 S 14th St, in Fort Calhoun, Nebraska.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance thereof by publication, said form of notice being a designated method for giving notice, an affidavit of publication being attached to these minutes.

Advance notice of this meeting was also given to the Mayor and all Council Members. Availability of the agenda was communicated in the advance notice and in the notice to the Mayor and Council Members.

In accordance with Section 84-1412 sub section eight (8) of the Reissue Revised State Statutes of the State of Nebraska 1943, as amended, one copy of all reproducible written material to be discussed is available to the public at this meeting for examination and copying.

Mayor Robinson stated persons wishing to address the Governing Body on an agenda item shall wait to be identified by the Presiding Officer; then, after stating their name and address for the record, may proceed to speak. Council discussed the shooting range lease agreement between the City of Fort Calhoun, Washington County Sheriff's Office, the Federal Bureau of Investigation, and the Omaha Police Department. Mayor Robinson explained that the three jurisdictions are looking for place to build an outdoor/indoor shooting range. This is the first step of many steps which will include negotiations for cost got a 25-year lease, then design phase (6ish months), application and public hearing(s) for a conditional use permit with Planning Commission and City Council. This will give the public a chance to speak on it and conditions can be set at that time. John Slader, 3116 US Hwy 75, indicated the land is a national historic landmark area and federal guidelines must be

Mitch Robinson Mayor Mayor met. Mike Szlachetka, 1610 Clay St, asked what the benefit would be. Mayor Robinson said the potential money as well as agencies bringing business to town. Justin Thompson, River Bend Campground owner, questioned why there are no limitations for hours. The Mayor and Council President Prieksat explained that is where the conditional use permit comes in and conditions such as that will be set. Lucas Billesbach, City Engineer, explained that any fire range is limited to specific uses and the city has the opportunity to say how it is used. Lucas clarified that the agreement is giving them the right to use the land, but conditional use permit is giving permission how it is used. John Linton, 409 S. 16th St, said for people that use the fort (living history, legion, Boy Scouts, etc) automatic firearms will deter people from going and thinks the outdoor range should be taken out of the agreement. He doesn't believe this is the correct property for an outdoor range and that it is too close to town. Tim Oelke, 1724 Monroe St, said that as a veteran it scares him when people are shooting, especially at all times of the day. Officer Judkins, Washington County Deputy, explained that there is nothing like this around here for training and this is a necessity to get the proper training to protect the community and the officers themselves. Richard Brock, 2271 Pony Ridge Ln, believes that is township road and asked why the Township Board hasn't been notified. He also suggested removing "hours of operation" from the agreement. Mike Hoefker, 5531 Co Rd 34, said he lives half a mile away from the property and is concerned with how close it is and the potential noise. Sheriff Robinson expressed that this is a need, not a want. Member Schuler made a motion seconded by Prieksat to approve the lease agreement contingent on amending "restrictions on use" to just say "hours to be determined through conditional use permit". With members Prieksat, Schuler, Bowser, and Kelly voting "Aye", motion carried.

The farm lease between the City of Fort Calhoun and C.E.M. Shaner Farms will remain in place.

Member Prieksat made a motion seconded by member Schuler to approve the Law Enforcement Services Contract renewal for 2022-2023. Sheriff Robinson said there was a 5.46% increase from last year. With members Kelly, Prieksat, Schuler, and Bowser voting "Aye", motion carried.

Following a motion and vote, Mayor Robinson declared the meeting adjourned at 8:21 p.m.
