


EQUIPMENT REFURBISHMENT IN PIONEER PARK

With the 1.5% Local Option Sales Tax approved by the voters in 2016 as the primary funding source, the community enthusiastically supported this splash pad project for the new Adams Street Plaza park. Both the city and the wider community embraced the Splash Pad part of the new park and made it a reality. Community groups raised an incredible amount of additional funds, businesses and individuals gave donations, and several grants were awarded for this project. This project resulted in great enjoyment throughout the

summer and it is just the beginning for the Adams Street Plaza.

MILL STONE

For over 100 years two milestones sat mostly unnoticed near the gazebo in West Market Square Park.
